Rationale For SLT:	It is typical for many students to dip in achievement in ELA as they enter high school. They largely have command of basic literacy skills, but struggle with the higher-order thinking skills and analysis that high school English classes demand. In order for them be successful in future English classes and eventually be ready for college-level literature, they'll need to concentrate on the literary analysis GLEs in the curriculum that are much different from what they experienced in middle school. According to the EAGLE pre-test, I have 32 students who are struggling with these particular skills. They
