

## **Institution Type** **(only one per institution allowed)**

- 01 School.** An institution that provides elementary, and/or secondary instruction (including Regular Ed Pre-kindergarten (24) and Kindergarten (25)); has one or more grade groupings or is ungraded; has one or more teachers to give instruction or care; is located in one or more buildings and has an assigned administrator.
- 02 Administrative Office.** A subsection within a larger organization that handles specific administrative functions for the organization (e.g., personnel services).
- 03 Not Used:** Previously assigned to Head Start Center (only).
- 04 Child and Adult Nutrition Site (only).** An administrative unit that participates in one or more of the Child and Adult Nutrition Programs. These programs exist to safeguard the health and well-being of children and eligible adults by providing nutritionally adequate meals that are available to all enrollees. This unit is not attached to any grade school and is not part of the school's kitchen.
- 05 Adult Education Site (only).** A single administrative unit that provides learning experiences concerned with the fundamental tools of learning for adults who have never attended school or who have interrupted formal schooling and need this knowledge and these skills to raise their level of education to increase self-confidence and/or self-determination, to prepare for an occupation, and to function more responsibly as citizens. Instruction is primarily for adults and youths beyond the age of compulsory school attendance in preparation for the General Equivalency Diploma (GED).
- 06 Postsecondary.** A single administrative unit that provides instructional programs (including curriculum, instruction, and related student services) for persons who have completed or otherwise left educational programs in elementary and secondary school. The general level of instruction provided for pupils in college programs, usually beginning with grade 13, and any instruction of a comparable nature and difficulty provided for adults and youth beyond the age of compulsory school attendance.
- 07 Non-education Site.** A supervised public or private facility designed to provide temporary accommodations for children or youth (e.g., adjudicated, institutionalized, or hospitalized youth) at which the reporting agency does not provide elementary and/or secondary instruction.
- 08 Home School.** A home schooling or study program established according to Act 838.
- 09 Preschool.** An institution designed to provide care for infant to preschool age children while providing, at the same time, educational experiences for them. (For Regular Ed Pre-K see 01 School)
- 10 Education Site (Not a School).** An educational setting or administrative unit that provides elementary, and/or secondary instruction (including Regular Ed Pre-kindergarten (24) and kindergarten (25)); has one or more grade groupings or is ungraded; has one or more certified teachers to give instruction or care; is located in one or more buildings, is not supported within or by a school.
